Action Item: Central Okanagan Public Schools Hockey Skills Academy Fee Increase (Canyon

Falls Middle School, École KLO Middle School, Mount Boucherie Secondary School, École OKM Secondary School, Rutland Senior Secondary School)

1.0 ISSUE STATEMENT

A proposal to increase fees for the Central Okanagan Public Schools Hockey Skills Academies at Canyon Falls Middle School, École KLO Middle School, Mount Boucherie Secondary School, École OKM Secondary School, and Rutland Senior Secondary School has been developed for approval by the Board of Education.

2.0 RELEVANT BOARD MOTION/DIRECTION

Policy 540 – Proposals for Substantive Change states the following:

"Any proposed changes to approved distinct schools, unique programs and specialty academies (e.g. increases in fee structure and/or program delivery) must be brought to the Board's Education and Student Services Committee in November of each calendar year to review and a recommendation to the Board for approval, prior to announcing the continuation of the distinct school, unique program or specialty academy for the upcoming year."

Policy 425R – Student Fees Regulations (Financial Hardship – Section 8.1) states the following:

"Principals shall annually notify parents through newsletters, notices to parents, and at the time of registration, that a student will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship."

3.0 BACKGROUND

The Central Okanagan Public Schools Hockey Skills Academy is looking to increase fees to compensate for the increased cost of renting ice and increased wages for the District Coordinator and for the on-ice instructors.

4.0 POINTS FOR CONSIDERATION

- Instructor wages have not been increased for many years. The District Coordinator is recommending that the wages be increased for the lead instructor by \$20 per session (\$125 to \$145) and for the assistant instructor by \$15 per session (\$115 to \$130).
- Increased costs are also due to the increased District Coordinator wage, resulting from the teacher salary increase.
- Cost of ice rental has continued to rise. (The MNP Place facility manager anticipates a 3-5% increase each year.)
- The academy is no longer affiliated with Hockey Canada, so there are savings on fees. A small fee has been added for Coaching Development Resources (e.g., Ice Hockey Systems subscription).
- Inflationary costs have increased expenses for many aspects of the program (e.g., wages and ice rentals).

Financial Implications: Below is a chart showing the cost of the Hockey Skills Academy in 2023/24 (average of 26 students) along with the projected 2025/2026 costs (average of 26 students).

As a result, below are the proposed fee increases that will make the programs financially sustainable moving forward:

In particular circumstances, the fee may be slightly reduced, depending on inflationary costs.

AND THAT: The Board of Education approve the proposed fee increase of \$35.00 (from \$965 to \$1000/student) for the Central Okanagan Public Schools Hockey Skills Academy (Mount Boucherie Secondary School), as attached to the Agenda, and as presented at the January 22, 2025 Public Board Meeting.
